Energy Advice Café

Energy Price Guarantee

The Energy Price Guarantee (EPG) is a scheme that caps the unit cost of energy per kWh for certain types of tariffs. This means that your energy bill will be no more than a certain amount each year, regardless of how much energy you use. The typical household will pay less than £2,500 per year under this scheme. However, some people are confused about how the scheme works, thinking that their bill will be capped at a fixed price. Money Saving Expert have created a calculator to help clear up this confusion.

Help With Childcare Costs

Free Childcare hours

Parents can get free childcare for their children if they are two years old or younger. If your child is three or four years old, you could still be eligible for 30 hours of free (government-funded) help from an approved provider every week during term time. Parents are entitled to tax-free childcare for kids up to the age of 11 and can get cash from Universal Credit for children up to the age of 16.
