



#### **EYFS**


Phonics started in first full week back. Kelly is taking some of our more settled children (those who took part in phonics in our Nursery provision and are ready to move forward).

#### Pupil Voice


"We play what's in the box" "We do some sounds and some writing." "We learn letters and also how to sound out words."
