To support parents in overcoming the problems head lice can cause, remember 'Once a week take a peek'. The sooner you do something about it, the easier it will be to resolve. If your child(ren) has live head lice, they have to stay away from school. If there are eggs present, your child can attend school AFTER treatment has been applied, and there are no live lice there. Schools no longer have 'Nit Nurses', so it is up to parents and carers to ensure you know what to look for and where to look.
