Actions

	Area of improvement	Current school procedures and next steps
1	How informed do you feel with regards to your child's homework?	An overview of homework procedures and expectations are shared at the beginning of each new academic year- reminders will be given out termly. Homework for Years 1-6 is shared on Showbie, which can be accessed through an APP or the Showbie website. Workshops for parents are also planned to support with current learning, and we will be arranging year group parent/carer coffee morning at the beginning of the summer term.
2	How informed do you feel with regards to how your child is doing socially at school?	Class teachers inform parents and carers of this as a standing agenda point in all parent/carer consultation evenings. Our new Golden Ticket award, Pupil Voice groups, and newly appointed kindness superheroes, from Reception to Year 3, are all indicators of positive social interactions. Class teachers are also available to discuss any concerns.
