Big Bang	Learning Outside of the Classroom

English	Children will belearning about their topic 'Who Let the Gods out?' through their writing. they will be writing an adventure story based on Pandora's box and then also an instructional text on how to care for a creature.
Maths	Children will be focusing on their times tables to prepare them for the timestables test. They will also continue looking at the 4 operations using formal methods and using these methods to complete two-step problems.
Science	The chidlren will be investigating sound including how sounds are made and how sounds travels.
History	Children will learn about the lasting impact of the Ancient Greeks on: democracy, architecture, art, mathematical and scientific thinking, culture and literature. They will look at the Athenians and Spartans in detail and their ongoing wars and look at how the Ancient Greek Empire expanded through invasions and conquests by Alexander the Great.
Art/DT	In this term, children will be looking at Ancient Greek vases and begin to design and create their own 3D forms using paper mâché, thinking carefully abotu shape and form.
Music	Children will continue to learn chords on the ukulele, revising ones learned earlier in the year.
Computing	In computing this term, children will be deeping their knowledge and skills in coding by using Scratch, building on their previous learning.
R.E.	Children will be looking at why do some people think that life is a journey, leanning about different relgiions to support this. They will be able to describe what happens in Chrisitan, Jewish and Hindu ceremonies of commitment and compare similarities and differences.
P.E.	This term will focus on rounders. Children will practice their throwing and batting techniques whilst learning the rules of the game
Personal Development	Children will be focusing on creativity and curiousity. Continuing to also learn about British Values and how these work in society.
