Using the Talk4Writing approach children will develop their skill of reporting information, creating non-fiction texts and looking at setting and character descriptions for story writing.
	Maths	This term pupils will be focusing on the links between fractions, decimals and percentages. Later on they will be refining their addition and multiplication knowledge for perimeter and area.
_	Science	Science this term will focus on living things and their habitats. We will explore life cycles of animals such as amphibians, mammals and insects. In addition we will be exploring the asexual and sexual reproduction of plants.
rummes	Humanities	In Georgaphy, we will be investigating the journey of a river and how the water cycle works influencing the features of a river. Children will locate rivers within the UK and look at flood risks and the use of the Thames barrier.
	Art/DT	In Art/DT, we will be investigating different types of lighting/alarm systems that can be found in buildings and switches to make a simple circuit.
	Music	In Music, we will be exploring rhythm and pulse using Charanga.
