Learning Outside of the Classroom

Using Forest School, we will be exploring living things and their habitats.

Old Father Thames

English

This term pupils will be using the text Floodlands and River Story to explore a range of poetic features such as personifying nature. Using the Talk4Writing approach children will develop their skill of reporting information, creating non-fiction texts and looking at setting and character descriptions for story writing.

Maths

This term pupils will be focusing on the links between decimals and percentages. Later on they will be refining their addition and multiplication knowledge for perimeter and area.

Science

Science this term will focus on living things and their habitats. We will explore life cycles of animals such as amphibians, mammals and insects. In addition we will be exploring the asexual and sexual reproduction of plants.

Humanities

In Geography, we will be investigating the journey of a river and how the water cycle works influencing the features of a river. Children will locate rivers within the UK.

Art/DT

In Art/DT, we will be investigating different types of lighting/alarm systems that can be found in buildings and switches to make a simple circuit.

Music

In Music, we will be exploring rhythm and pulse using Charanga.

Computing

The children will be creating digital story boards with a complete narrative using a variety of apps.

R.E.

This term, we will be looking at 'what would Jesus do'? Lessons will cover forgiveness, The Good Samaritan and justice & fairness.

P.E.

Tennis and dance is the focus this term. Children will be using their movement skills to develop hand/eye coordination and developing awareness of effective use of space.

Personal Development

This term the focus is on Equality, Human Rights and British Values. Pupils will focus on identifying different types of media and their purposes and how to recognise suspicious content.
