Shakespeare and will paint it with watercolours.

Throughout this term, the children will be writing a dilemma story involving a character having a magical mishap, and a biography of William Shakespeare. In EGPS, they will be focusing on skills needed for accuracy when writing and word classes.

During Autumn 1, they will be recapping and learning within the number and counting topic. After this, they will move on to the four operations - addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. There will be an additional focus on learning timestables.

Children will be building on their knowledge gained during KS1 about the circulatory system, and to be able to discuss the features of each organ. They will take part in scientific enquiries where they will be using various equipment with precision and accuracy.

Students will continue to get an understanding of their local area and how it has changed over time. A focus will be how the area was used within the Elizabethan era with a particular focus on links with the Tudors. Children will also learn about The Plague and the impact it had on London.

In this unit, children will explore how art can impart emotions on the observer. They will continue to develop their sketching skills, such as hatching, knowing when to sketch and when to render more confident lines, with a focus on charcoal and chalk. Sketches will be inspired by core books.

Children will be learning about what Tudor music sounds like, instruments used, and how to describe the music played then, comparing it to music from now.

The focus of this term will be E-Safety. Children will learn how to use technology safely; respectfully and responsibly; recognise acceptable and unaccaptable behaviour; and identify a range of ways to report conerns about content and contact.

Children will be learning aboout Christianity but also non-religious groups such as Humanists. They will answer questions including, how should we care for others and the world? What can we learn from religions about deciding what is right and wrong? And does religion help people be good?

During P.E. the children will be perfecting their teamwork skills by playing tag rugby. They will need to strategise together as a team, and hone their running, catching and throwing skills.


Personal Development
