Stand and Deliver

English

This term pupils will be using the text 'The Highwayman' to explore a range of characters in fictional descriptive writing. Using the Talk4writing approach they will develop their use of authors purpose by focusing on vocabulary and sentence structures to make their writing more interesting and enjoyable to read. After studying it, they will use the old English style of the poem to write.

Maths

During Autumn 1, the children will be recapping and learning within the number and counting topic. After this, we will move on to the four operations - addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. There will be an additional focus on learning timestables.

Science

Children will be building on their knowledge gained during KS1 about the circulatory system, and to be able to discuss the features of each organ specifically the heart. They will take part in scientific enquiries where they will be using various equipment with precision and accuracy.

History

In History, the children will be focusing on the local area and how it has changed over time. They will be learning about how the local area was used during the Elizabethan era and the early 19th century.

Art/DT

In this unit, children will be building on their knowledge of pulleys and gears. They will develop their technical knowledge of building circuits and using construction kits. They will be building up to designing a guillotine linked to their book 'The Highway Man'.

Music

The children will be learning about the Ukelele this term in music. They will learn how to read music and eventually learn how to play a song with different chords. By the end of term, the children will be able to tune a ukelele and change the pitch.

Computing

This term, Year 6 will be focusing on social media and how to keep safe online using social media apps, discussing age restrictions.

R.E.

Children will be learning about Christianity but also non-religious groups such as Humanists. They will answer questions including, how should we care for others and the world? What can we learn from religions about deciding what is right and wrong? And does religion help people be good?

P.E.

During P.E. the children will be perfecting their teamwork skills by playing tag rugby. They will need to strategise together as a team, and hone their running, catching and throwing skills.

Personal Development

This term, pupils will be covering health and relationships education. Topics they will broach include, marriage, the LGBTQ+ community, democracy, good friendships and positive relationships.
